Glossary
of
Terms

Detoxification:

A medical procedure which removes a toxic and dependent substance from the body. Detoxification facilities offer a safe environment in which certified or medically trained professionals aid in the detox process.

Medication Assisted Treatment:

Treatment approach administered by a medical professional which utilizes prescription drugs to treat a substance use disorder. This type of treatment can be used in an inpatient or outpatient setting.

Outpatient Day Rehab with Alternative Schooling:

Treatment services in which the individual can remain living in the community. Individuals travel to the treatment facility, where an individualized action plan is for their recovery. These facilities specialize in adolescent services and accredited education in an on-site alternative school.

Crisis:

Chemical dependence crisis facilities provide short term withdrawal and stabilization services. These inpatient programs seek to engage those in need and link them with further treatment.

Outpatient:

Treatment services in which the individual can remain living in the community. Individuals travel to the treatment facility, where an individualized action plan is developed and implemented.

Inpatient:

Facilities in which an individual remains, 24 hours, 7 days a week for usually 28 days. While at these facilities the individual receives short-term, medically supervised substance use disorder treatment including an intensive evaluation and rehabilitation services.

Residential Living:

Treatment for individuals who feel it is necessary to live in a structured inpatient setting in order to maintain abstinence and sobriety. These individuals are not in need of an acute hospital or a psychiatric setting.
