DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY

I, Edward P. Romaine, Supervisor of the Town of Brookhaven, pursuant to Article 2-B Section 24 of the New York State Executive law, hereby certify as follows:

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization designated the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern;

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, United States Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a public health emergency for the entire United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, cases of transmission of COVID-19 have been documented in the Town of Brookhaven and more are expected to continue; and


WHEREAS, the Town of Brookhaven is addressing the threat that COVID-19 poses to the health and welfare of its residents and visitors.

WHEREAS, the State of New York by Executive Order No. 202 dated March 7, 2020, has addressed the transmission of the cases of COVID-19.


1. The Executive Order dated June 30, 2020, extended and/or amended on July 10, 2020, July 17, 2020, July 21, 2020, July 31, 2020, August 5, 2020, August 17, 2020 and August 25, 2020, and September 2, 2020, is hereby extended and provision 3r is modified as follows:
 - 3r. Any building permit, Fire Prevention new permission or new Installation permit, issued by the Town of Brookhaven between March 1 and May 15, 2020, which expires within 12 months of issuance shall hereby be valid for 18 months from the date of issuance. All open building permits existing between March 1, 2020 and May 27, 2020, shall automatically be extended by 75 days from the date of expiration. However, this shall not apply to any building permits that are for construction not paused by COVID-19 Executive Order, including but not limited to affordable housing and energy construction.
2. The Executive Order regarding outdoor eateries dated June 11, 2020, extended and/or amended on July 10, 2020, July 17, 2020, July 21, 2020, July 31, 2020, August 5, 2020, August 17, 2020, August 25, 2020, and September 2, 2020, is hereby extended.

3. The Executive Order regarding drive-in establishments dated June 11, 2020, extended and/or amended on July 10, 2020, July 17, 2020, July 21, 2020, July 31, 2020, August 5, 2020, August 17, 2020, August 25, 2020, and September 2, 2020, is hereby extended until December 31, 2020, and provisions 7 and 8 are modified as follows:
 7. Only one (1) food truck or mobile concession is permitted for each drive-in movie event, which is located in a specifically designated and approved area, provided that all queue lines have floor markings at a distance of six (6) feet apart in order to ensure that individuals maintain a six (6) foot distance. No amusement/carnival rides or games shall be permitted for any events.
 8. Attendees shall remain within their vehicles at all times except to utilize the restrooms or make a purchase from the one (1) food truck/mobile concession situated in the designated and approved area. No outdoor seating is permitted for viewing purposes.
