This year the Town collected the following:

Electronic waste: 14,832 lbs.

Drug take back: 14 boxes

Shredding: 13,580 lbs.

Councilwoman Bonner said, "The proper disposal of electronics and paper shredding are good for the environment and taking back old medications helps prevent misuse and abuse. I thank all the residents who stopped by to do their part in making Brookhaven a safer and greener place to live."
