The event features a Pharmaceutical Take Back from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm, Paper Shredding from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm and an E-Waste Drive from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Representatives from Recyclebank will also be in attendance to speak with residents about how they can earn rewards for green actions.

Representatives of the Town's Office of Energy and Sustainability will be in attendance to speak about home energy efficiency programs that are available to Brookhaven residents.

At the Paper Shredding event, residents can bring their papers in boxes or bags to be safely and securely shredded and recycled. Documents can remain stapled together, but rubber bands, paper clips and other metal must be removed.
