Farmingville, NY – Brookhaven Councilman Neil Foley was joined by State Senator Tom Croci and Assemblyman Al Graf at the demolition of a long vacant commercial building located at 300 Main Street in Holbrook. The building deteriorated over the years and the Town issued numerous building violations to the property owner. Recently it was deemed unsafe and slated for demolition by the Town. The property owners elected to demolish the building at their own cost. Also at the demolition were local business owners and members of the Holbrook Chamber of Commerce.

Councilman Foley said, "This building has been an eyesore in the heart of Holbrook's downtown business district for more than 10 years and I am pleased to see it finally come down. I appreciate the efforts of the Town's Law and Building Departments, the Holbrook Chamber of Commerce, Senator Croci and Assemblyman Graf for all they did to help clean-up this property."
