

Councilman Foley Joins SCPD to Announce Raid on Medford and Patchogue Massage Parlors

Farmingville, NY – On January 26, Councilman Neil Foley joined with Suffolk County officials and members of the Suffolk County Police Department (SCPD) to announce that seven spas in Patchogue and Medford were raided. The action comes after a joint investigation by the SCPD and the Brookhaven Town departments of Law and Fire Prevention that was initiated by complaints to Councilman Foley’s office that the businesses were being run as illegal massage parlors. The businesses were all located on Route 112. The Town Law Department issued more than 40 appearance tickets to the business owners, six businesses were shut down and five of the locations were condemned by the Town for various health and safety reasons.

Councilman Foley “This is an issue that is very important to me and the residents of Patchogue and Medford. By closing down these illegal businesses, we have taken a big step to improve the quality of life in the community. I thank the Suffolk County Police and our own Law Department and Fire Marshal for their efforts to put a stop to this illegal activity.”
