

Councilman Panico Working With Osprey Point Civic Association

Farmingville, NY - Councilman Dan Panico moves two pieces of legislation to further protect and clean up the community.

Councilman Panico, in his continuing effort to protect the community residents and reduce vandalism in the Town of Brookhaven's Osprey Park, authorized the acceptance of a security camera system, including multiple cameras, DVR recording unit from the Osprey Pointe Civic Association.

Osprey Pointe Civic Association through efforts of yard sales, donations and some of the neighborhood children sold lemonade to raise money to purchase the equipment to protect the effort and resources recently completed to upgrade the Town of Brookhaven's Osprey Park.

In addition, Councilman Panico sponsored and passed a resolution to enter into an agreement between the Osprey Pointe Civic Association and the Town of Brookhaven to enter into a maintenance agreement with the Osprey Pointe Civic Association for the adoption and maintenance of the triangular parcel of land located at the corners of Grassmere Drive, Shore Drive and Park Place in Mastic Beach. The land had become a dumping ground for garbage and other inappropriate activities.

"This is a great demonstration of partnering between the Town of Brookhaven and Osprey Pointe Civic Association." Said Councilman Dan Panico (6th Council District) "These programs serves to both promote and protect the community. Since taking office, I have made it my personal goal to help improve the quality of life in the Sixth Council District and working with the local civics and residents on projects like this definitely puts us in the correct posture to succeed."
